Re: New Protocols

The approved North Country REMAC 2012 ALS protocols are effective.

All pre-hospital care providers that operate above the basic level within the North Country region are required to attend an ALS Protocol update, complete a Protocol update exam with a passing score, and read, accept, sign and complete a current provider agreement form.

As part of this agreement, all advanced care providers must satisfy the required continuing medical education program as described in the CME Credentialing manual. CME semesters run from January to June, and July to December.

To be credentialed in the NCEMS Medical Control System, all advanced care providers must:

- ◆ Be a member/employee in good standing of an ambulance service currently in the NCEMS Medical Control System, which is REMAC approved to provide advanced patient care at or above your level of certification.
- ◆ Provide the NCEMS Program Agency a copy of their current NYS DOH EMT Certification card, Agency Affiliation, mailing address, phone number, and photo ID.
- ◆ Complete a protocol exam with a score of 80% or greater
- ◆ Sign a provider policy agreement.
